### President's Message

Compatriots,

The French Republic threw out the Roman Julian calendar in October 1793. They replaced it with a unique calendar with months and days named after natural events or things. "January" was bisected and became "Nivôse" (Month of snow) which covered the Julian Calendar dates December 21 to January 19. "Pluviôse" (Month of rain) lasted from January 20 to February 18. Thomas Jefferson ended his stint as our country's first secretary of state in 1793. Jefferson supported the French Revolution but one wonders how he felt about the French Republic's new calendar. Did his agrarian mind applaud the change? Did his diplomatic experience abhor the added complication during diplomatic exchanges?

This month our chapter will be transitioning to its 2025 board of managers. These men will be sworn on January 11. Also on January 11th our chapter will be supporting Charles City County's AMREV 250 Committee's inaugural commemoration of a January 1781 skirmish which took place at the Charles City Courthouse. It will be held at the Charles City Courthouse and starts at 2:00 PM. The event honors the county's patriots who were involved in a lopsided battle against British Colonel John Simcoe's Queen's Rangers. Simcoe and about 40 of his men surprised the militia who were guarding the courthouse and quickly routed them. Compatriot Bruce Laubach actively assisted Charles City County 250th Committee during its planning sessions since August 2023. Thanks for your efforts, Bruce!

Dress: Black tie, formal Scottish kilt, or business suit. Decorations may be worn.





#### **Tidewater Virginia Patriot of the Month**

# Henry Tazewell (1753-1799) President Pro Tempore of the U.S. Senate

TAZEWELL, Henry, (Father of Littleton Waller Tazewell), a Senator from Virginia; born in Brunswick County, November 27, 1753; attended the rural schools; graduated from The College of William and Mary at Williamsburg in 1770; studied law; admitted to the bar and commenced practice in 1773; member, provincial house of burgesses 1775; raised and was commissioned captain of a troop of cavalry in the Revolutionary War; delegate to the state constitutional convention of 1775 and 1776; member, General Assembly 1778-1785; judge of the Virginia Supreme Court 1785-1793, chief justice 1789-1793; judge of the high court of appeals 1793; elected in 1794 to the United States Senate to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of John Taylor, reelected in 1798, and served from December 29, 1794, until his death; served as President pro tempore of the Senate during the Third and Fourth Congresses; died in Philadelphia, PA, January 24, 1799; interment in Christ Church Cemetery (Source: Biographical Directory of the U.S. Congress; Image Credits: Virginia Museum of History and Culture and the Library of Congress).






# Williamsburg Chapter Membership-Mentor Committee

## Chaplain's Corner – By George Corbett, Chaplain


#### A New Year



#### Revolutionary War Book of the Month – By Stephen Holm, Sergeant-at-Arms





#### William Washington: Cavalryman of the Revolution

The book by Stephen E. Haller, previously the manager of Archives and Records for the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation in 2002 when he wrote this book, is well written and one of the best biographies written about Colonel William Washington. Washington, a cousin of commander in chief George Washington, served throughout the long war, providing Murphy with an opportunity to tell the military story of the Revolution through one officer's exploits. After a brief description of William Washington's youth as a second son of the Virginia elite, Murphy turns to his military career.

William Washington was one of a small, loyal cadre of key field officers who served with distinction in the Continental Army through the entire War. He was born in Stafford County, Virginia to one of Virginia's elite families and was a cousin to George Washington. William Washington was among the first group of Virginia youth to answer the call to arms helping form a Stafford militia company in the summer of 1775. He later was commissioned as a captain in command of an infantry company in in the 3rd Virginia Infantry Regiment of the Continental Army. He distinguished himself at a number of engagements including the Battle of Trenton before being promoted to major by George Washington and transferred to the Continental Cavalry. He initially served as a major and lieutenant colonel supporting cavalry operations in the middle states (1777-1779). However, he is best remembered as the commander of the 3rd Continental Light Dragoons during the southern campaign of 1780-1781 in the Carolinas, serving under Generals Benjamin Lincoln, Daniel Morgan and Nathaniel Greene. He and his unit played a major role in a number of key engagements including Cowpens, Nathaniel Greene's race to the Dan, Guilford Courthouse, Hobkirk's Hill, and Eutaw Springs. Washington was a gallant battlefield commander who personally led his men. During the Battle of Eutaw Springs (September 1781) his horse was shot from under him and pinned him to the ground where was severely wounded by a bayonet and captured. He remained a prisoner at Charleston, South Carolina until the British evacuated the city in December, 1782. During the Campaign in the Carolinas, General Nathanael Greene once referred to "Light Horse Harry" Lee as his "eye", but he called Colonel Washington his "arm." The final chapter of the book addresses Washington's prosperous postwar career as a rice planter and politician in South Carolina.
