

Revolutionary War History Fact of the Month

DID ANY VIRGINIA REVOLUTIONARY SOLDIERS FIGHT IN THE WAR OF 1812?

The short answer is yes. How many is another question as there is no way to know for sure how many served in both wars. From the beginning of the Rev War to the beginning of the War of 1812 was thirty-six years. If a Rev War soldier was 16-17 by the end of the Rev War he would have been born about 1767. In 1812 that soldier would be 45 at the start of the War of 1812. By 1792 Virginia and all other states were subject to the Militia Act of 1792 and its provisions governing the organization of state militias. The act left it to the states on how the militia was to be organized and the rules for governing the call up of the militia. In Virginia, all able-bodied men between the age of 18 and 45 were liable to serve. Those over 45 were exempted. An examination of Virginia militia books by the author indicates that solders who were found to be over the age of 45 were dismissed from service. How many who were 45 or over and continued to serve either unnoticed or purposefully overlooked is an open question. In 2022 Mike Lyman of the SAR and Society of the War of 1812 in Virginia compiled a list of 153 men who served in both wars and their known burial sites.

Officers were exempt from this rule. We have a very good idea of how many of these officers, especially of general rank, served in both wars. During the War of 1812 thirteen of the twenty-one brigadier generals and four of the five major generals had Revolutionary War experience making them extremely valuable to the state. Field grade officers tended to younger and not old enough to have fought in both wars. The author estimates that based on a limited sample that perhaps 10-15% of these officers served in both wars (submitted by Stuart Butler).


Edmund Burke's Speech

On 22 March 1775, less than a month before the "shot heard around the world" that began the American Revolution, British Statesman, Edmund Burke, gave a speech to the British Parliament in which he described the colonists spirit and love of freedom. His opening remarks provide a great description of our patriot ancestors' feelings at the time. He said, "A love of freedom is the predominating feature which marks and distinguishes the whole: and as an ardent is always a jealous affection, your colonies become suspicious, restive, and untractable [sic], whenever they see the least attempt to wrest from them by force, or shuffle from them by chicane, what they think the only advantage worth living for. This fierce spirit of liberty is stronger in the English colonies probably than in any other people of the earth; and this from a great variety of powerful causes; which, to understand "the true temper of their minds, and the direction which this spirit takes, it will not be amiss to lay open somewhat more largely."

Let us, as their prodigy, maintain this spirit in keeping the Torch of Freedom alight in today's world.

God of our fathers, grant that we may always be mindful of the love and spirit of freedom that led our patriot ancestors on their quest for a nation of free citizens. May we pass this love and sprit to future generations so that they may continue the great nation that we inherited from our fathers. We pray this in Your Most Holy Name. Amen


